First: What is God's goal in

creating and governing the world?

SHIH 43

"Bring all who claim me as their God, for I have made them for my glory. It was I who created them." Isaiah 43:7





"Whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God." 1 Cor. 10:31



God's glory is

the perfect <u>harmony</u> of all his attributes

into one infinitely beautiful and personal being. The glory of the Lord is everything that makes God, God, All His characteristics.

God is glorified when he, in his full perfection, is esteemed, praised, worshiped & valued in proportion to his worth.

God's glory is magnified when his full perfection is esteemed, praised, worshiped & valued by others.

Side note: When God says that he created us for his glory, it does not mean that he created us so that he would become more glorious.

Side note: His beauty and perfection is not somehow increased by us. It is unthinkable that God should become more perfectly God by making something that is not God.

What it means then to be 'created for the glory of God' is: that he created us to display his glory, that is, that his glory might be known and praised.

Man was created from the beginning in God's image that he might image forth God's glory. He was to multiply and fill the earth so that the knowledge of the glory of God would be magnified all over the earth. (See Gen 1:27-28)

Instead man chose to rely on himself and seek (glorify) his own glory—to make a name for (magnify) himself. (See Gen 3:5, 11:4)

"...they became fools and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images made to look like a mortal human being..." Romans 1:22-23

Ever since the fall of man into sin, people have refused to align themselves with this divine goal.

But all of *God's* acts have been **aimed** at seeing it through.

But now, this is what the LORD says—he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine." Isaiah 43:1

"I created you."

"He created them male and female and blessed them. And he named them "Mankind" when they were created." **Gen 5:2**



"I formed you."

"For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb." Psalm 139:13



"I redeemed you."

"In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace." **Eph 1:7**



"I summoned you."

For this is what the Lord has commanded us: "'I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth."" Acts 13:47



"You are mine."

"You belong to God." **1 John 4:4** "You are...God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness" **1 Pet 2:9**

Second:

Acknowledge God's ownership.

"since what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them." Romans 1:18



Be thankful for God's provision.

"...they **neither** glorified him as God nor gave **thanks** to him " **Romans 1:21**



Submit to God's design.

"They **exchanged** the truth about God for a lie." **Romans 1:25**



Adopt God's purposes.

"Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."
