


LAST Week...



Sin is the action that arises when we believe that the **world** offers the superior glory and pleasure.

Faith is the action that arises when we believe that God offers the superior glory and pleasure.



A deep confidence and an assuring hope of future good things...

(namely the enjoyment of himself)

...which **God has**promised to provide
to those who believe...

...which are far beyond comparison of anything that the world system,
Satan and man's imagination can devise.

'Faith' means being satisfied with all that God promises to be for us in Jesus.

'Obedience' then is
what we do or what our
lives look like when we
are satisfied with all that
God promises to be for
us in Jesus.

Obedience is:

the correlating <u>action</u> that outwardly <u>displays</u> this deep inner confidence and assuring hope of God's goodness.

Faith is the confidence in the design and instruction of God to provide ultimate good, reward/personal benefit.

Obedience is the submission to the design and instruction of God.

Sin is the **lack of confidence** in the **design** and **instruction** of God... which displays itself in displayer.

Romans 16:25-27

Now to him who is able to establish you in accordance with my gospel, the message I proclaim about Jesus Christ,

Romans 16:25-27

...in keeping with the revelation of the mystery hidden for long ages past, but now revealed and made known through the prophetic writings by the command of the eternal God,

...so that all the Gentiles might come to the obedience that comes from faith, to the only wise God be glory forever through Jesus Christ! "to the only wise God be glory forever" is the ultimate goal of all things in these verses.

"the obedience of faith"

Is the WAY the

ultimate goal

(glory of God)

is accomplished.

This is because when faith in Christ produces obedience, those obedient lives make God look glorious.

That's what Jesus said in Matthew 5:16:

"Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." God's word is the fuel.
Faith is the heat.
Obedience is the flame.



The Bible, all of life, all of history, has this great aim:



That Jesus Christ would be seen as glorious & magnificent among all the peoples of the world...

...by means of the obedience of Christians which flows from their faith in him.

Simply, obedience shows the world the superiority of the promises of God to the fleeting promises of sin.



Obedience occurs when the believer <u>severs</u> the root of sin's promise by the power of a <u>superior</u> promise...and acts accordingly.

Hebrews 11:17

By faith Abraham, when God tested him, offered Isaac as a sacrifice. He who had embraced the promises was about to sacrifice his one and only son.

Hebrews 11:24-26

By faith Moses, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter. He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin.

Hebrews 11:24-26

He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward.

Obedience begins with <u>faith</u>.

By faith Moses...


What we are truly 'trusting in' determines our actions.

If we are 'trusting in' what God says and says the future holds...


we obey!

All true belief has action. We act inline with what we really believe.

Obedience occurs when God & God's promises are cherished.

Abraham <u>embraced</u> the promises...



Moses <u>regarded</u> Christ as of greater <u>value</u>



We act inline with what we love, value and cherish most.

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind..." Luke 10:27 "No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money." Matt 6:24

"All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth.

(Hebrews 11:13)

Our moment by moment choices display whose side we are really on.

Obedience often, if not always, involves <u>risk</u>.

Abraham was about to sacrifice his only son...



Moses chose to be **mistreated**...



Our obedience to God will often mean loss, disadvantage, harm, scrutiny and less comfort in this life.

"Everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution." (2 Timothy 3:12)
