

Paragraph 1 v1-v2

Jude introduces himself, God and his audience.

Paragraph 2 v3-v4a

Jude introduces his **purpose**; stand firm against false teaching.

Paragraph 3 v4b-v7

Jude gives a <u>history</u> of what <u>happens</u> to those who resist God's authority.

Paragraph 4

v8-v11

Jude <u>compares</u> the ungodly of this age with those in the past. Paragraph 5

v12-v13

Jude compares the ungodly to <u>calamities</u> in nature.

Paragraph 6

v14-v16

Jude <u>warns</u> of the coming judgment against those who live <u>against</u> God.

Paragraph 7

v17-v19

Jude <u>reminds</u> the church that these things had been <u>predicted</u> by God and his apostles.

Paragraph 8

v20-v23

Jude calls the believers to action during these hostile times. Paragraph 9

v24-v25

Jude <u>closes</u> by focusing on what God has <u>promised</u> to do and be for all believers.

Key Concept

They follow their natural instincts ...did not stay within the limits of <u>authority</u> but left the place where they belonged.
(God gave)... <u>claim authority</u> ...defy <u>authority</u>.

Key Concept

A major theme was those who 'left', 'did not remain', 'did not stay'...under God's authority.

In response, God will keep them...

 God has kept them securely chained in prisons of darkness, waiting for the great day of judgment.

Key Concept

A major theme was those 'stand firm' or 'defend' or 'keep [them]selves' (stay/safe) under God's authority.

In response, God will keep them...

 God the Father, who loves you and keeps you safe in the care of Jesus Christ. All glory to God, who is able to keep you from falling away and will bring you with great joy into his glorious presence...

The controversy.

Some claimed that you can be kept safe under God's grace...while deny God's authority in your daily life (actions).

The truth.

You can not presume to be safe within God's grace...while denying God's authority in your daily life.

Lists.

There are many lists in the book of Jude...all of them very important to the message of the book.

Major List Category 1

Lists of God's actions & attributes.

who <u>loves</u> you and <u>keeps</u> you safe...May God give you more and more <u>mercy</u>, <u>peace</u>, and <u>love</u>. **V1-2**

All **glory**, **majesty**, **power**, and **authority** are his... **v25**

Major List Category 2


Lists of ungodly actions.


These people are <u>grumblers</u> and <u>complainers</u>, <u>living only to</u> satisfy their desires. They <u>brag loudly</u> about themselves, and <u>they flatter</u> others to get what they want. **v16**

Major List Category 3

Lists of godly directives.

...<u>build</u> each other <u>up</u> in your most holy faith, <u>pray</u> in the power of the Holy Spirit, and <u>await</u> the <u>mercy</u>...**v20-21**

Try to determine the meaning of words/concepts

you didn't understand

(cross-referencing, e-sword, commentaries)

Begin to try to <u>answer</u> the questions that were generated through your observation phase.


Re-write your summaries

of each paragraph; if the questions you asked gave you a newer, stronger meaning of the passage.

Look for concepts:


concentrate on the truth (theological concepts) summarize the main theological arguments presented.

Summarize the main concept being communicated beside each paragraph, or when a new one is introduced.



Example:

Through what Jesus accomplished one behalf of believers, God will keep them from falling away and will bring them into his presence without a single fault.



Example:

Because unbelievers do not have God's Spirit within them they live solely to satisfy their own desires.

Example:

Believers do have the power of God's Spirit in them and should build each other up and pray all the while they away for Jesus to return.
