In that case, our faith would be in history and facts.





Rather, our goal is to build your faith that the Bible is indeed the Word of God because:

"...the LORD God formed a man from the dust of the ground and **breathed** into his nostrils **the breath of life**, and the man became a living being." **Gen 2:7**






Just as Adam came alive when God breathed into him, the Bible is alive and powerful because every word was <u>breathed</u> by God.




Your heart convicts you that it is.

Already we can see two major themes:




The most important book of all time.

The Bible is the <u>only</u> book in the world authored **by the One true God**.




The Bible is not mans ideas, but God's own word.



The Bible has absolute unity from beginning to end because God is its true one author.




Where the Bible **appears** to contradict or lack unity, we should assume the error is on our part in understanding, not on God's part in communicating or **preserving** His




Theme: God's Word is perfect, containing no error.






When we talk about the 'Bible' or 'God's Word':


We mean, we believe that this book is God's Word (communication) to us, in written form, preserved until now.






God caused these prophets and writers to write <u>exactly</u> what he <u>intended</u> to communicate to the world.








Another major theme we will see over and over is that: God wants to work with humanity to accomplish his will.

- -Israel was God's megaphone, broadcasting God's message to the whole world.




The copying by men called Scribes was done with extreme care.



"They used every imaginable safeguard, no matter how cumbersome, to ensure the accurate transmission of the text. The number of letters in a book was counted and its middle letter was given. Similarly with the words, and again the middle word was noted. This was done with both the copy and the original autograph to insure that they were exactly the same." (The Illustrated Bible Dictionary, Part 3, J.D. Douglas p.1538)

The original manuscripts were written in: Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek. We have it in many English versions today via translation.


Below is the **Hebrew** word in **Mal 3:1** for **"my messenger"** (Malaki) and the **Greek** word in **1 Cor 1:1** for **"a messenger"** (Apostolos)



Though every word was copied by hand, there are more ancient <u>manuscripts</u> of the Bible than any other ancient document.



The Bible is an accurate historical record of what we can & do know (science, history) and events/history that we know actually happened (places, culture, disasters, names, dates). The Bible agrees with other historical



On several occasions places or people specifically mentioned in the Bible were not discovered until centuries later...

such as an island mentioned in the New Testament or the underground springs/water system that Solomon built in Israel mentioned in Ecclesiastes 2:6.

The Bible appeared to be 'in error' until these discoveries were made. New discoveries only serve to echo and reinforce the absolute accuracy, authority and authentic of every word God has given us in his book! We will see over and over again that God's Word is perfect, containing no error. We can trust it.

In 1947 the Dead Sea Scrolls were recovered. Prior to these scrolls being found, the earliest **original** biblical writings we had were dated **980 AD**.





The Dead Sea Scrolls were dated back to **250 BC**. Getting us nearly 1,300yrs closer to the original copies.

Before these scrolls; the **earliest original** copy of the Book of Isaiah was 1700 years removed from the time of Isaiah (**The Masoretic Text**).

The Dead Sea Scrolls dated within 500 years of the writing of Isaiah, they contained 22 manuscripts of Isaiah. "When scholars compared The Masoretic Text of Isaiah to the Isaiah Text in the Dead Sea Scroll (nearly 1,300 years of copying) the correspondence was astounding..." The texts from Qumran proved to be word-for-word identical to our Standard Hebrew Bible in more than 95 percent of the text.

The 5 percent of variation consisted primarily of obvious slips of the pen and spelling alterations." (Archer, 1974, p. 25)

What that means is; the book of Isaiah we have now in our Bibles today, translated from the Standard Hebrew Bible is identical to the copies of the book of Isaiah written 250 years before Christ, minus some spelling variations (cultural, periodic spelling alterations).

- "For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished." (Matthew 5:18)
- "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away." (Matt 24:35)



The Bible is not just another 'religious' book. Many men have written books trying to tell men about God.



God is the author of the Bible...



and in it He reveals Himself to us. In the Bible God tells us who He is and what He wants us to know about Him. In the Bible God tells us about ourselves; our relationship to Him, to the world around us, to one another, for now and for all eternity.



The Bible is God's personal message to each one of us.



It is the only book with absolute authority on the most important issues in life. It can tell us about who God is, what God wants, who were are and what matters forever...

No one can 'prove to you' that the Bible is accurate, or that God indeed spoke it.



I can not convince you that the Bible is exactly as God spoke it or that there even is a God...I could show you a lot of science, research and facts that come pretty close to proving it...and only confirm even more what I already know to be true. The Bible (and God) doesn't need proving, evidencing or defending... our heart, mind and soul and **bears witness** to the fact that they both are real, alive, powerful and true. We either choose to accept that conviction from Him or reject it.



God wants us to believe, trust and have confidence that the Bible is his word, simply because he say's it is...not primarily because you hear a great scientific or historic argument for the validity of the Bible. Evidences do exist and are a great encouragement to our faith. But the aim of Christianity is for mankind to believe what God says...regardless of what the evidence says...and believing that 'the Bible is the inerrant word of God' is a good place to start.
