




God had lovingly, carefully, perfectly created everything in preparation for his final creation: **Mankind**



The earth was prepared for man's existence in days 1-6





Adam is the first ancestor of all people, regardless of race, culture, ethnicity or location.




Adam is YOUR ancestor and MY ancestor. We all came from this first man! He is the beginning and father of the entire human race!

responsibility.




The newly created world

"Now the LORD God had planted a garden in the east, in Eden; and there he put the man he had formed."





"The LORD God made all kinds of trees grow out of the ground—trees that were pleasing to the eye and good for food."

God planted an endless variety of trees which supplied food for man and gave beauty in the garden. Only one tree was denied to Adam.




God instructs Adam.

God **knows** what is best and **wanted** what was best for Adam.

Adam could choose to

obey-trust-depend on God;
knowing that God's choice was
the best for him...



...or he could **disobey** God by **not trusting** that God knew best, wanting to be independent.



God decided that Adam needed a wife to help him and to be his companion!

He brought the animals to the man to see what he would name them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name.

So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds in the sky and all the wild animals.

But for Adam no suitable helper was found.

So the LORD God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of the man's ribs and then closed up the place with flesh.




Then the LORD God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man.
