






More importantly:

What did Jesus say about the purpose of every believer?





The summary of the
purpose of the Church
according to Jesus can be
summarized in three
statements.

Jesus replied:

“Love the Lord your
God with all your heart
and with all your soul and
with all your mind.’ This
is the first and greatest
commandment.

And the second is like
it: ‘Love your
neighbor as yourself.’

All the Law and the
Prophets hang on these
two commandments.”

Therefore go and make
disciples of all nations,
baptizing them in the name
of the Father and of the Son
and of the Holy Spirit, and
teaching them to obey
everything I have
commanded you.”

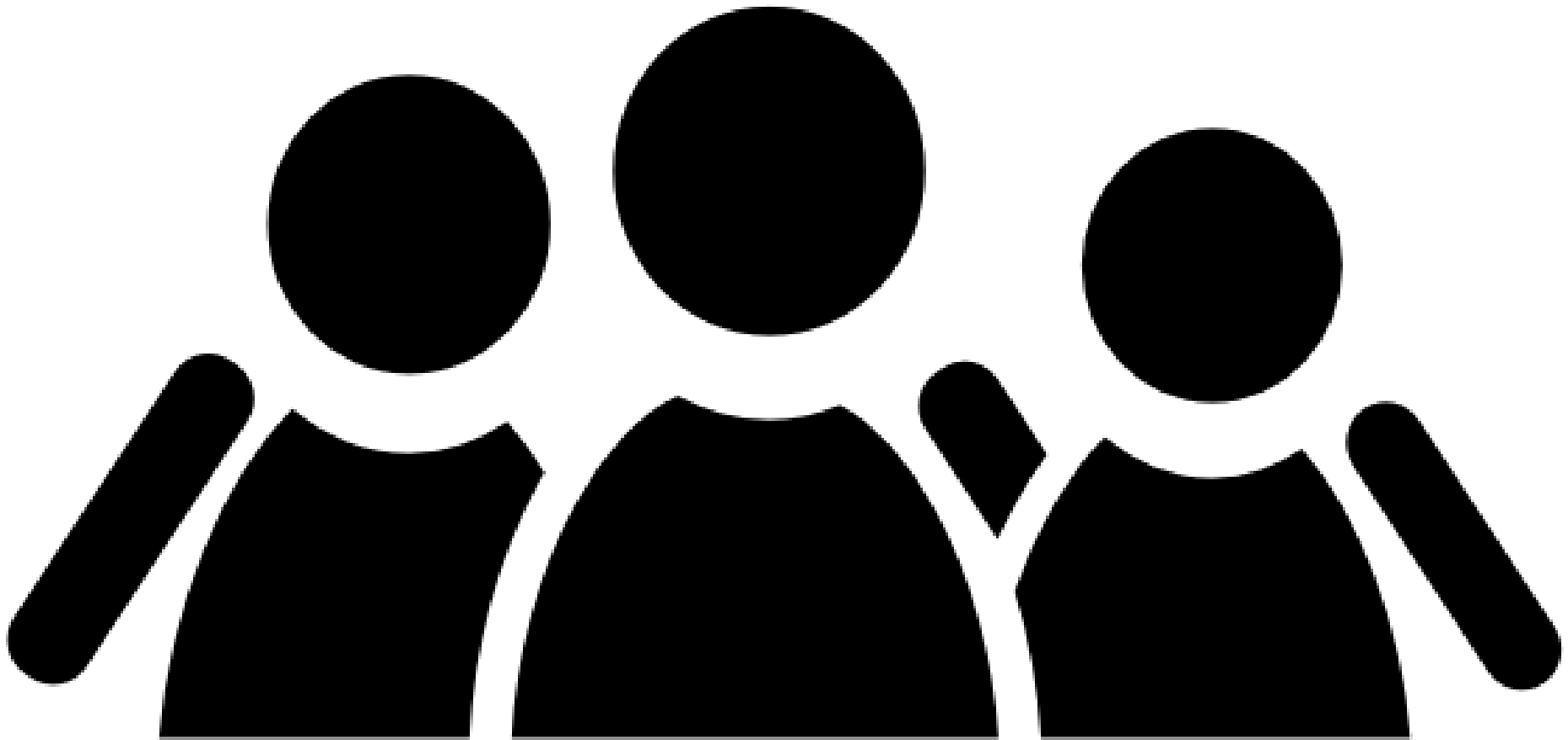

Purpose 1

Love God with all your heart

“Worship”



Worshiping God is the Church's first purpose. All throughout scripture we're commanded to magnifying the Lord and exalt his name.



Glorify the LORD with me; let us
exalt his name together. Ps 34:3

Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his
name; **worship the LORD** in the splendor
of his holiness. Ps 92:2

Worship the LORD in the splendor of his
holiness; **tremble before him**, all the earth.
Ps 96:9

And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. **This is truly the way to worship him.** Romans 12:1

Examples from the Early Church in ACTS

They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. They **worshiped together** at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity—all the while **praising God** and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. **Acts 2:45-47**

Purpose 2

Love your neighbor

“Ministry”



Ministry is demonstrating God's love to others by meeting their needs and healing their hurts. The church is to ministry to all kinds of needs: **spiritual, emotional, relational** and **physical**.

They sold their property and possessions and
shared the money with those in need.

Acts 2:46

All the believers were united in heart and mind. And they felt that what they owned was not their own, so they shared everything they had. The apostles testified powerfully to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and God's great blessing was upon them all. There were no needy people among them, because those who owned land or houses would sell them.

Purpose 3

Go and make disciples
“Evangelism”



The church exists to communicate God's word. We are ambassadors for Christ and our mission is to evangelize the world. It is **EVERY** Christian's responsibility to share the Good News wherever we go.



We are to tell the whole world of Christ's coming, his death on the cross, his resurrection, and his promise to return.

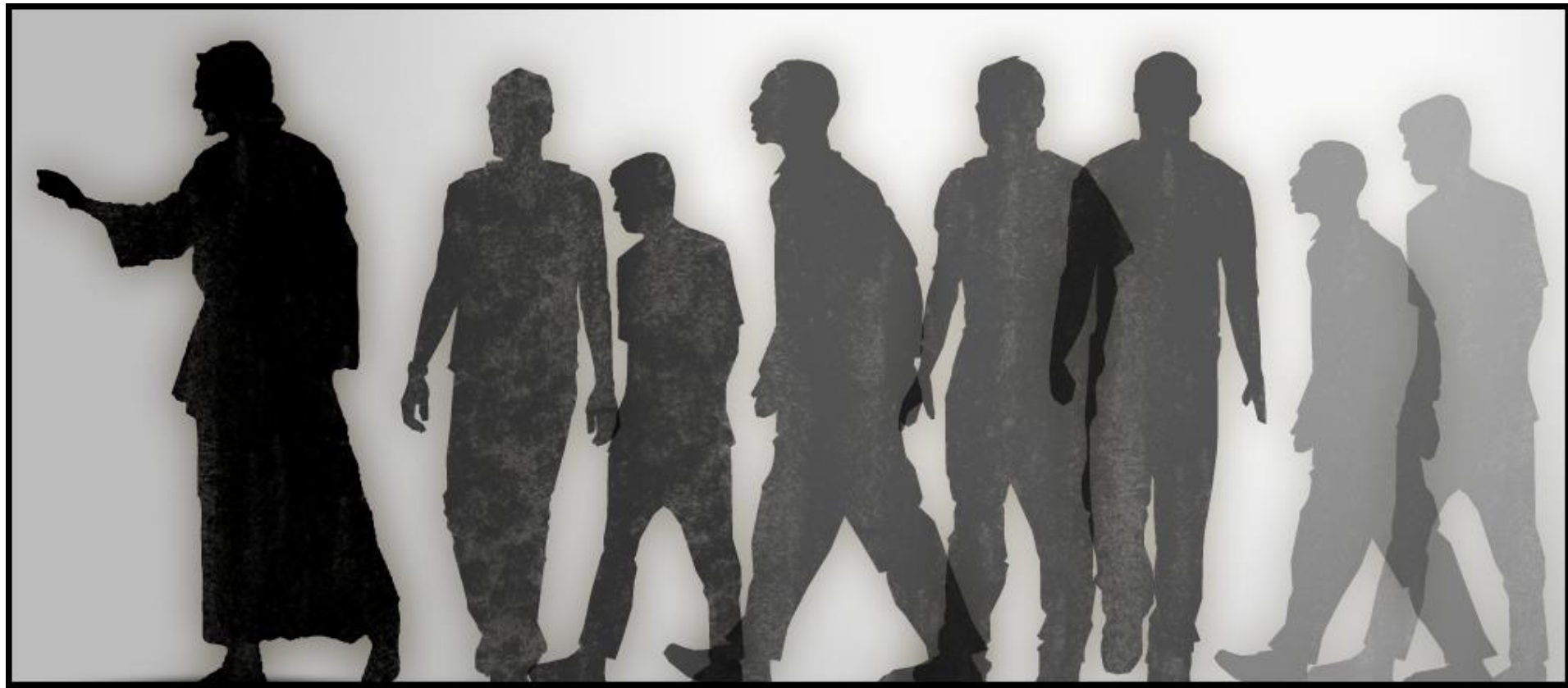


Someday each of us will give an account to God regarding how seriously we took this responsibility.

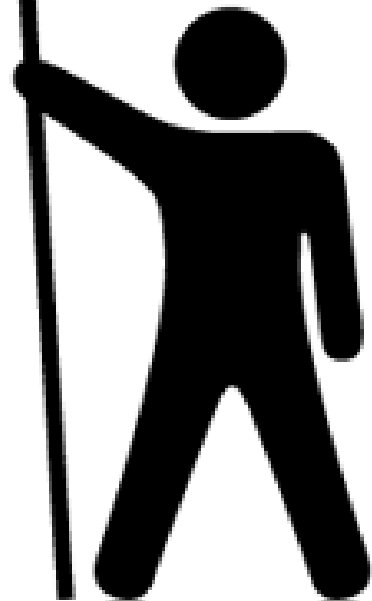
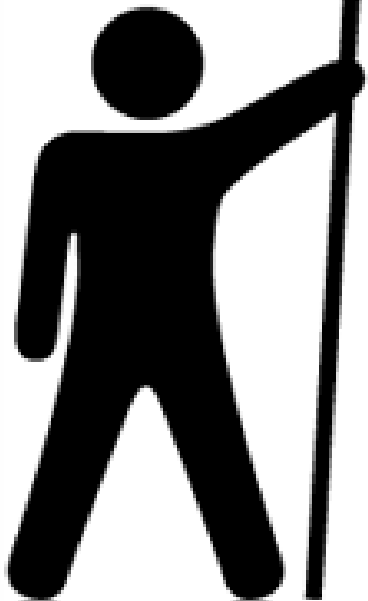

Purpose 4

Baptizing them

“Fellowship”



As Christians **we're called to belong**, not just believe. Baptism is not only a symbol of salvation; it is a **symbol of fellowship.**



It not only symbolizes our new life
in Christ, it visualizes a person's
incorporation into the body of
Christ. It says to the world,
"This person is now one of us!"
We are not alone. We have each
other for support.

Examples from the Early Church in ACTS

“All the believers were united in heart and mind.”

Acts 4:32

“All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals *(including the Lord’s Supper)*, and to prayer.

Acts 2:42

Shared their meals with great joy and generosity.

Acts 2:46

“Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the Day approaching.” **Heb 10:25**

Purpose 5

Teaching them to obey

“Discipleship”



The church exists to
edify, or educate,
God's people.

Discipleship is the
process of helping
people become more
like Christ in their
thoughts, feelings,
and actions.



“Don't copy the behavior and
customs of this world, but
let God transform you into a
new person by changing the
way you think.”

Romans 12:2

This process begins when a person is born again and continues throughout the rest of their life.

Colossians 1:28 says, "We continue to preach Christ to each person, using all wisdom to warn and to teach everyone, in order to bring each one into God's presence as a mature person in Christ"

As the church we are called not only to reach people, but also to teach them. After someone has made a decision for Christ, he or she must be disciplined.

It is the church's responsibility to develop people to spiritual maturity. This is God's will for every believer.

The Purpose of every church and every individual believer:

To bring people to Jesus and **MEMBERSHIP**
in His family...to develop them into Christ-like
MATURITY, and to equip them for their
MINISTRY in the church and to send them
out on a **MISSION** in the world, in order to
MAGNIFY God's name.
