God Delivers Peter: Acts 12

Read: Acts 12:1-19
This account is very important for many reasons. But the six that we will primarily focus on today are;
#1 Experiencing is not an indication of God's
Peter was arrested in Acts 4 as well as here in Acts 12. But it is clear that these difficulties were not because the Lord was disapproving of Peter or his ministry. In Acts 2:14, 41 it was Peter's boldness and moving speech that led 3,000 to the Lord and in Acts 3:12 & 4:4 another speech led 2,000 to the Lord. No one else in church history can claim those types of immediate and dramatic results!
So clearly; experiencing difficulty is not necessarily an indication of God's disapproval of your life or ministry.
If anything, scripture implies the opposite that great difficulty is usually the to great impact.
#2 God loves to put believers into situations that are
impossibleso that power can shine through.
It is very obvious in the way that Luke wrote this account that <u>he wanted to stress the</u> <u>level of security that was placed around Peter</u> . Peter was clearly in a humanly impossible situation. There was no way that Peter or any other group of people could rescue him.
1. He was put in prison (v4) 2. Four squads of soldiers to guard him (v4) 3. Sleeping between two soldiers (v6) 4. Bound with two chains (v6) 5. Sentries guarding the door (v6)
#3 God has ordained that the of believers can, and
will the course of human history.

It is very obvious in the way that Luke wrote this account that <u>he wanted to stress the importance of prayer and its impact on Peter's release</u>.

...but earnest <u>prayer</u> for him was made to God by the church. (v5)

where many were gathered together and <u>were praying</u> . (v12)
#4 What is impossible for man is impossible for God.
It is clear that it was impossible for Peter to free himselfand that God was the one who freed him in the end.
an angel <u>of the Lord</u> stood next to him (v7) And the <u>chains fell off</u> his hands. (v7) the iron gate <u>opened for them of its own accord</u> (v10)
#5 Do not expect to easily what God is up to.
Both Peter and the believers initially did not immediately recognize what God was doing.
He did not know that what was being done by the angel was real, but thought he was seeing a vision. (v9) They said to her, "You are out of your mind."and saying, "It is his angel!" (v15)
#6 Never doubt that a small group of, praying, can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has!
It is very obvious in the way that Luke wrote this account that <u>he wanted to stress the importance of believers meeting together and its impact on Peter's release</u> .
