# The Attributes of God: Week 4, Goodness

# When we speak of the goodness of God, we do not mean:

**-Moral goodness**: God is holy, righteous and morally good, flawless in fact. However that specific attribute would be; **'The Righteousness of God.'** 

## When we speak of the goodness of God, we mean:

- **-The benevolence of God towards man**: The goodness of God is what inclines Him to be kind, loving, gracious, benevolent and full of goodwill towards mankind.
- **-Something that God is:** Divine goodness, as one of God's attributes, is not something God wants to be, tries to be, decides to be, is more often than not...Being good & loving is something that God is and always will be, by very nature.
- **-Something that is immutable:** Since God is immutable (unchanging), He never varies in the intensity of His loving-kindness. He has never been kinder than He now is, nor will He ever be less kind.

He is tenderhearted and of quick sympathy, and His unfailing attitude toward all moral beings is open, frank, and friendly. By His nature He is inclined to bestow blessedness and **He takes holy pleasure in the happiness of His people.** (A.W Tozer)
