

There are two great "books" which God has published for (1) the knowledge of Him and (2) the instruction of men...

(1) His creation (2) His scripture; and this psalm addresses them both, and recommends them to our attention.


(1) His creation tells us of His divine attributes, His incredible power & wisdom and His goodness to all.

...what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them. For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse. (Romans 1:19-20)

(2) His scripture

tells us of His authority over humanity, instructs us of right & wrong, convicts us of sin & confirms our duty to obey.

All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)



David says that God displays His glory in the creation of the world; His glory, authority, sovereignty, power, majesty & wisdom are on display through what He has made.



God's creation proclaims His existence, wisdom & power.

For by Him all things were created, both in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities-- all things have been created through Him and for Him. Col 1:16



(3) There is no speech, nor are there words, whose voice is not heard.



(4) Their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world.



David says that God displays His glory in the creation of the world. And its convicting cry goes silently out to all the world...day after day...and very few hear it.

The whole world is a witness.




David says that everyone is a witness to this testimony, day after day, decade after decade.

And out of this display should come a praise of His name and a worship of His glory...and failure to is guilt!



All of mankind is without an excuse.






David is amazed, when he contemplates God's grand purpose for creation.

David realizes that everything in the universe has a specific, set, established and appointed place in the purpose of God's display of His majesty.

David is amazed, when he contemplates God's design for the display of His glory & power in creation ... specifically in the placing of the sun.



Even God's most *powerful* creation in the universe was *placed* with a specific *purpose*.



David is even more amazed, when he contemplates how joyful the sun is (must be) in fulfilling God's purpose for him (it). Day after day he gladly obeys God's design.


Like a 'groom' the sun is totally content and full of *joy* with his position.



The sun (and universe) displays God's <u>order</u> and <u>laws</u> in the <u>physical</u> universe.



The sun (and universe) displays the joy that comes from submitting to God's purpose & design in the physical world!



David transitions from talking about the physical universe to talking about the spiritual or moral universe (humanity).

God's word displays God's order and laws in the spiritual universe.






David tell us that men and women can be as happy as the sun (rest of creation) by following His moral laws, commands day after day, decade after decade.



When we <u>submit</u> to His law/order/purpose we will be <u>filled</u> with joy. Just like the sun.

(9) the fear of the LORD is pure, enduring forever; the rules of the LORD are true, and righteous altogether.





(10) More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb.



More than anyone else (except Christ), David understood that God's instruction (and obeying it) was the only true way to be happy and therefore he desired hearing from & obeying God more than anything else.



(11) Moreover, by them is your servant warned; in keeping them there is great reward.




(12-13) Who can discern his errors?

Declare me innocent from hidden faults. Keep back your servant also from presumptuous sins; let them not have dominion over me! Then I shall be blameless, and innocent of great transgression.




Our greatest desire should be to please and honor our Creator by gladly submitting to His design...and to not grieve Him with sin.



(14) Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer.



David knew that the only way to experience true joy was to submit to the truth and align his life to the truth about God and about himself in God's word & world.



sub-mit

Accept or yield to a superior force or to the authority or will of another person.

And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies (submit) to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice the kind he will find acceptable (design). This is truly the way to worship him. Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world (design), but let God transform you into a new person (submit) by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect. (Romans 12:1-2)
