Disciplines of a Disciple: Prayer





is a **follower** of Christ who is careful to **observe** and **keep** the **commands** of Christ and the **instructions** he gave.



is a Christian who increasingly desires
to be like Jesus and therefore prioritizes
their life according to his will; by obedience to
his commands, love of his Father, submission to
his Spirit and conformity to his likeness.

The major theme in all of these definitions is:

Obedience to the commands or the instruction of Christ

Therefore a major aspect of becoming a disciple or making a disciple is obeying & teaching all the commands of Christ.

DID YOU KNOW



There are 147 commands of Christ in the gospels.

There are 1433 instructions to disciples in the New Testament.

What we want to try and do over the next few weeks is focus on the major commands that a disciple is instructed to obey over & over.



That is, of the 1000s of things a disciple is to be & do, we want to focus on the main things that a disciple is commanded be & do over & over to in the New Testament.



5 Major DISCIPLINES FOR TRAINING IN GODLINESS

of a Disciple

Praying



The discipline of regularly communicating with God.

Studying



The discipline of consistently learning

from the Word of God.

Walking

The discipline of increasingly growing in obedience to God.

Living

The discipline of graciously interacting with other people.

Telling



The discipline of devoutly sharing

the truth with other people.

Praying-Studying-Walking-Living-Telling are the main disciplines in the engine room of the disciple.



Praying-Studying-Walking-Living-Telling become the locomotive that leads the rest of a disciple's life & growth.


Prayer

Prayer is **expressing** our thoughts, concerns, desires, fears & questions to the God of the universe.





When we think of prayer we often only think of the "talking" part of the conversation...and usually overlook the "listening" part of the conversation.





The danger of thinking of prayer as only "talking" to God is that it can become easy to pay little to no attention to God. Prayer includes talking to God about our thoughts, concerns, desires, fears.

Prayer includes <u>listening</u> to God's Spirit as he responds, urges, comforts, nudges, warns, compels etc.

Prayer includes <u>paying</u> <u>attention</u> to God by focusing on God's **Word**, God's **instruction**, God's **character**, His **Son**, His **Spirit**, & His **actions** in the world...

"To have God speak to the heart is a majestic experience, an experience that people may miss if they monopolize the conversation and never pause to hear God's responses." Charles Stanley

And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. Ephesian 6:18

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

Philippians 4:6

Rejoice always, **pray continually**, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. James 5:16

Developing & Instilling #DISCIPLINE OF PRAYER



Set a time.

Reserve slots in the day or week when you can set aside *consistent* blocks of time to just to pray.



Set an alarm.

Use your phone or watch to **remind** you of your **commitment** to pray. We will do what is scheduled, we will neglect what is unscheduled.



Set a place.

Find a quiet, removed & private location where you can go to *concentrate* on the Lord.



Get a routine.

Build prayer into the <u>convenience</u> of your daily routine. Make prayer a part of all the important things you do in a day.



Get a journal.

Record your prayers in a notebook. This way you will be able to <u>celebrate</u> all of God's answers to prayer in your life & others.



Get a partner.

Invite someone to join you in your praying. We will be more likely to be faithful in prayer if we do it collectively.





ADORATION



We express our adoration and praise to God. We worship him in prayer for the wonder of His greatness, His sovereignty and mighty power. We *praise* and *honor* God for who He is and what He has done.

CONFESSION Sorry!

Confession means to agree with God about our sin. Confession involves <u>repentance</u>. Confession means we admit to God that we are wrong and He is right, in specific areas. We ask for His forgiveness and strength to change.

THANKSGIVING



We express <u>appreciation</u> to God for what He has done for us and others. Our <u>gratitude</u> pleases the Lord. Prayers of thanksgiving are meant to thank God for everything He has done for us.

SUPPLICATION



Making <u>requests</u>. We pray for other people and their needs and for our own needs. Pray not just for physical things (provisions, healing, needs) but also spiritual things (to grow with God, to commit to Him more each day, to grow in knowledge of Him, salvation & sanctification of others).
