The discipline of consistently learning


from the Word of God.



Living means that; in all of our relationships we attempt to honor God

by displaying our love & devotion to him, through our obedience & submission to his will, in all the ways that we interact with others.

Love must be sincere...Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves...Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality. Romans 12:9-10, 13

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited. Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Romans 12:14-18

Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not murder," "You shall not steal," "You shall not covet," and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no harm to a neighbor. Romans 13:8-10

And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well. If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles. 

Developing & Instilling #DISCIPLINE of Living



Display.

Make all of your relationships an opportunity to <u>demonstrate</u> your love for God, your faith in His Word & your <u>devotion</u> to Him.



Emulate.

Make it your goal to get as close as possible to imitating Christ in all of your interactions. Study the life of Christ. See how he treated people!

Pray before each choice, action & reaction.

Ask the Lord for strength, wisdom & guidance.



Model.

Go out of your way to ensure that your actions are <u>reflecting</u> accurately what Godly <u>relationships</u> look like to younger believers.



Consider.

Take the time to <u>ponder</u> how your actions, words & reactions may be <u>perceived</u> and interpreted.

Take time in each major interaction to pray.

Evaluate many potential outcomes & effects.

Stand in the other person's shoes and try to see how they may view your actions.



Initiate.

Take the initiative in the direction & flow of the relationship. Don't always be reactive.

Take the lead in the direction of conversations.

Allow your maturity to dictate the <u>content</u> & <u>culture</u> of your relationship.

Be the first to confess wrong doing, be the first to love, serve, give etc.







Eternalize.

Make every interaction <u>reflect</u> the <u>reality</u> of eternity. Realize that every comment, every action is weighty, significant and forever!

Review what you know about the future & eternity.

Allow the truth about eternity to convict you enough to change course on a certain choice.

Remind yourself that you will be accountable for every careless word uttered.



Love.

Make 'loving as Christ loved' the <u>highest</u> aim in all of your relationship & interactions.

Ask yourself: How would Jesus demonstrate love in this situation?

Ask yourself: What would be the highest display of God's love in this?

Ask yourself: How would I perceive love if the shoe was on the other foot?



Serve.

Find ways to serve as Christ served in all of your relationships & interactions.

Be familiar with the best ways to help those closest to you. Pay attention. Observe.

Dive in. Don't hold back.

Don't hesitate. Don't have to be asked.

Bring someone along with you in all of your serving.



Give.

Find ways to give just as God has so graciously given you and I all things.

Be <u>attentive</u> to the daily and on going needs of those closest to you.

Allow the Holy Spirit to show you where you might be able to help in a specific area.

When you see a need, don't hesitate, meet the need at once. Practice being the first to respond.

Sorry! Apologize.

Be quick to <u>apologize</u> when you get it wrong! Be ready to <u>admit</u> when you did not reflect your trust in God in your actions.

Respond when the Holy Spirit points out a failure in one of your relationships.

Go to the person <u>right away</u> and be willing to admit your error and right any wrongs.

When someone comes to you to apologize, forgive without keeping a <u>record</u> of wrongs.
