Use that issue to transition into the truth.

Ask questions: Have follow up questions already ______ in your mind that help you discover if they have heard you and if they have understood, and if they believe the truths you presented.

Model the truth: Always seek to model in your speech, your behavior, your attitudes, your values, your spending etc. that God is the Author & the Authority...that you have sinned & Christ is the only Savior etc.

Witnessing

Spot openings: Always be looking for an opportunity in their life where you could boldly share the gospel. Classic examples are death, loss, suffering, crisis, tragedy, pain, addiction & disappointments.

Take your chance: When those opportunities arise you must, by the power of the Holy Spirit boldly walk through that door. You must not hesitate. Remember prior spiritual conversations to build from.

Know the Gospel: When those opportunities arise you must, know how to summarize the Gospel into a condensed yet very clear and accurate picture. You must **familiarize yourself** with what you would say...or you won't know what to say!

Answer questions: Be able to answer the questions they may have about God, sin, salvation etc. Be able to **back up** the truths that you just shared with more evidence, more scripture and clear life examples.

Get a response: If you believe that you have shared effectively and they have understood adequately you should **gently push** for some type of response. **"Do you believe any of that...?"**

Meeting

Find a need: People will be more likely to do a study on a topic that they are currently with (a topic vs a book of the Bible); finances, marriage, parenting etc.

Get a resource: Find a resource (a book study or video series) that is 3-6 weeks in nature that will effectively and directly address their current need/struggle.

Make the offer: Lay the ground work for an offer. Find the material and then follow through with an offer to meet with them for a **specific period of time**.

Stick to it: People will flounder in their commitment and follow through. You have to push and take the ______ to ensure that the study will occur. Make it more attractive with food & fun.

Get to the Gospel: Our ultimate goal is twofold; 1) To have finances/marriage to point to the gospel and 2) To possibly get to a study of the Gospel!
